A three-year project with a national cohort of 15 rural community colleges will work with each other — and with community partners in their regions — to implement the guided pathways framework.

Participating colleges commit to:

- Designing and implementing a better student experience at their colleges.
- Collaborating with key stakeholders in their regions to increase economic opportunity and partner on a cross-sector approach to implement guided pathways.
- Implementing evidence-based reforms that will address inequities and lead to improved educational and workforce outcomes.
- Covering the cost of travel to and dinners at the in-person Rural Pathways Institutes

What colleges should consider applying?

- College that have established the conditions that will enable their institutions to implement at scale pathways reforms.
- Ideally, colleges that have already begun the process of laying the groundwork for and/or implementing guided pathways and the underlying practices.
- Some colleges that may be far along in the implementation process that need to delve more deeply on certain areas of the framework.
- Successful colleges will demonstrate that they have the internal culture and the external partnerships needed to advance this work.



Criteria for Application Review

- Description of the college service area and student population
- Notable national/state student success initiations and/or regional economic development initiatives
- Regional economic mobility opportunities/constraints
- Existing college partnerships and/or new opportunities
- The college's experience with guided pathways to date including developmental education reforms
- > The college's readiness to implement guided pathways
- > The top priorities the college articulates for this project
